

About the Festival...

Cootehill Arts Festival was conceived in 1988 with the 1st Annual Festival taking place from 15th to 23th October. David Gallagher was Chairperson, Vera Greenan Secretary and Fergus Mulligan Treasurer. The late Dermot Healy provided invaluable assistance both with the numerous contacts he had from touring the country, to advice on how Arts Festivals operated. Around this time, the Arts Council had instituted a policy of supporting the Arts throughout the country and not just in Dublin and the Cootehill Arts Festival committee was fortunate that they could avail of this funding over the following years.

In 1989, David stepped down as Chairperson, but stayed on the Committee and Una Smith (Dermot's sister) took over as Chair. The Festival ran very successfully until 2005. Over the years as well as the aforementioned individuals, many people became

synonymous with the Festival namely Kay Phelan, Roisin Lyons, Anne and Seamus Tully, Brian Reynolds, Jacinta Gallagher, Pete Ward, and many other individuals who gave of their time and energy tirelessly. They brought world-class artists to perform in Cootehill. We owe them a debt of gratitude for the foundations they laid.

In 2016, following representations from the Footsbarn Travelling Theatre Group (who first came to Cootehill as a result of their friendship with Dermot Healy), it was decided to stage two events featuring Footsbarn. This was a sell-out, and as there had been numerous calls down through the years from the younger generation to revive the Festival, members of the original committee, augmented with new younger members got together and re-formed the Cootehill Arts Festival Committee, under the Chairmanship of Artist John Blakey.

About the place...

Sweet Cootehill Town is located in South Ulster among drumlins, lakes and rivers, on the Cavan/Monaghan border. It is an area of outstanding beauty and natural resources. Cootehill was formally established as a market town almost 300 years ago by Thomas Coote and had strong links to the flax industry. It is laid out in a cruciform shape and has a number of buildings of historical interest.

Nowadays, it is a thriving country town, with a population that's being augmented by blow in's over the years, from the teachers who arrived following the establishment of St Aidan's Comprehensive school in 1966 to the many young men who arrived from all over the country in response to the Northern Troubles, and were stationed at Tanagh Army Barracks with the 27th Infantry Battalion C Company.

Today, despite the economic struggles of the last 10 years, Cootehill has emerged stronger and more vibrant, with full employment, thanks to a number of strong employers in Abbott Nutrition, Abcon Industrial Ltd, PQE, EMCA, Mastek, Carleton Cakes. There are vibrant sporting clubs covering a wide range of disciplines in the GAA, Soccer Club, Camogie,

walking, running, cycling and open water swimming. Arts are well represented with an amateur painting group, drama group, traditional Irish music classes and an Irish language speaking group. There are plans for an Arts centre, the array of activities and interests illustrates the creativity, diversity and initiative of the people of Cootehill.

Cootehill, with the Holy Family School and Drumlin House Training Centre and Print workshop has become a supportive community for children and adults with special needs. In addition, it is a multi-denominational town with excellent crosscommunity relations.

Down through it's history, Cootehill produced many political leaders, innovators, entrepreneurs, contrarians, artists and shakers. So to the present day wonderful people have emerged from the local community showing leadership and innovation. All things considered, while the outlook for towns of our size around the country is problematic, here in Cootehill, we see hugely positive developments in the town and look forward to a vibrant and lively future for ourselves, our children and grandchildren.


