Submit only what is relevant and necessary for your application

It is better to submit one high-quality example rather than a large amount of lesser quality, irrelevant material.

common pitfalls

submission incomplete - review check list on brief or add brief cover letter stating what you have included

idea undeveloped or too obvious

idea not connected to its context

proposal unconvincing

submission of more than one idea - uncertainty?
each must be clear and original

not enough detail in proposal

proposal concentrates on written more than visual

no budget - public funding

common pitfalls

idea too similar to previous work - unoriginal

more historical than contemporary - lacks connection with today

more commercial than artistic - artistic intention

title of proposal as Gaeilge or in other language with no translation

self praise

cv & biog - write outside yourself, do not over embellish

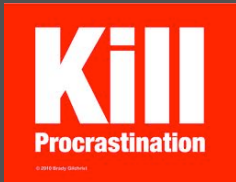
